










How to draw a manu - by Dave Gunson

You'll need a pencil, a pen and an eraser... and some blank paper, of course!

 <p>1 Lightly draw two circles - one small (for the bird's head), and one a bit larger (for the bird's body), slightly overlapping.</p>	 <p>2 Now connect them, above and below.</p>	 <p>3 Add a small triangle at the front of the small circle - this will be the bird's bill.</p>
 <p>4 Now place another very small circle just behind the bill, and a little bit higher - this is the bird's eye.</p>	 <p>5 Imagine a large 'teardrop' shape on its side, and draw this on the side of the bird's body- this will be the wing.</p>	 <p>6 Draw long lines at the back of the bird's body, and join them together at the end with curves - this is the tail. Draw two lines at an angle from near the back of the bird's body - yes, these will be the bird's legs. Most birds have two three toes at the front, and one toe at the back - so now you can add these.</p>
 <p>7 Now you can carefully rub out all those lines that you don't need any more.</p>	 <p>8 Go over the lines with a pen, or with your pencil once more to make the lines stronger. Now you can add some extra details - make the bill and the eye darker (leave a white spot at the top of the eye, to make it look realistic), and add the lines of the feathers in the wing. And there's your bird - all ready to colour in any way you want to!</p>	 <p>9 Make your bird fly by lifting its wings (add one on the other side) and tucking up its legs!</p>
